Dear Attorney General Limtiaco:

Hafa Adai! Over the past few days several concerns have arisen regarding the Government of Guam's procurement of community outreach services for the Port Authority of Guam. As you may know, the Port Authority's expansion effort has been significantly funded by a federal grant from the Department of Defense's Office of Economic Adjustment.

Based on the information before me today, it appears that the Port's primary contractor on this matter, Parsons Brinkerhoff, won its contract through the government procurement process. I have also been assured that the involvement of any subcontractors is also consistent with the requirements of law.

That said, I believe that our Government's procurement processes exist to protect the best interests of the People of Guam, and as such must be both transparent and completely beyond question. I am asking that your office conduct an independent review of all procurement processes regarding this matter.

Though our procurement laws are well defined, grants which involve both federal and local entities can encompass several interwoven complexities. It is my hope that after your office's full and independent review, our process will be further validated or enhanced with your recommendations.

Finally, I would note that the Office of the Governor, Chief of Staff George Bamba and all other parties involved with this issue fully support your independent review. I thank you in advance for your timely consideration of this matter.
