The Office of Congresswoman Madeleine Z. Bordallo and the Office of Governor Felix P. Camacho, in partnership with the National Park Services War in the Pacific National Historic Park, are working to update the list of names on the Memorial Wall at the Asan Bay Overlook to commemorate all who endured during the occupation of Guam.

The current list of names on the Memorial Wall at the Asan Bay Overlook can be viewed on the website of the War in the Pacific National Historical Park at www.nps.gov/wapa. This list should be referenced to verify whether your name or the name of a relative should be *included or corrected* on the Memorial Wall.

Pursuant to Public Law 103-109, the Memorial Wall at the Asan Bay Overlook includes names of the following:

1. U.S. Marines, Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, and Coast Guardsmen who died during the Battle for Guam: July 1, 1944 – August 10, 1944;
2. People of Guam who died as a result of the Occupation of Guam: December 8, 1941 – July 21, 1944; and
3. People of Guam who suffered personal injury, forced labor, forced march, or internment as a result of the Occupation of Guam: December 8, 1941 – July 21, 1944.

If your name or the name of a relative is eligible for correction or inclusion on the Memorial Wall at the Asan Bay Overlook based on the dates provided above, please review the following steps for the application process:

Applications Filed By Eligible Individuals Residing ON-ISLAND:

- Step 1: Visit the website of the War in the Pacific National Historical Park to view current list of names to verify eligibility.
- Step 2: Download and complete Memorial Wall Name Application. Downloadable application can be retrieved from www.house.gov/bordallo or <http://guamgovernor.net/>
- Step 3: Complete application and submit along with a copy of a government issued photo identification, *in person*, to the Office of Congresswoman Bordallo *or* the Office of Governor Camacho.
- Step 4: Submit application by June 30, 2008.

Applications Filed By Eligible Individuals Residing OFF-ISLAND:

- Step 1: Visit the website of the War in the Pacific National Historical Park to view current list of names to verify eligibility.
- Step 2: Download and complete Memorial Wall Name Application. Downloadable application can be retrieved from www.house.gov/bordallo or <http://guamgovernor.net/>
- Step 3: Have completed form notarized by a licensed Notary Public.
- Step 4: Mail notarized application and a copy of a government issued photo identification to the Office of Congresswoman Madeleine Z. Bordallo *or* the Office of Governor Felix P. Camacho.
- Step 4: Submit application by June 30, 2008.

Applications Filed By PROXY On Behalf of Eligible Individuals:

- Step 1: Visit the website of the War in the Pacific National Historical Park to view current list of names to verify eligibility.
- Step 2: Download and complete Memorial Wall Name Application. Downloadable application can be retrieved from www.house.gov/bordallo or <http://guamgovernor.net/>
- Step 3: If proxy resides on-island, form must be submitted IN PERSON. If proxy resides off-island, application must be notarized by a licensed notary public. If in the military and stationed overseas, form must be certified by any commissioned officer, warrant officer, or non-commissioned officer of a grade not lower than sergeant or equivalent rating of the Armed Forces of the United States; or before any commissioned officer of the Merchant Marine of the United States; or before any minister, consul or vice-consul of the United States, in lieu of a notary public. Overseas applicants must MAIL application to the Office of Congresswoman Madeleine Z. Bordallo *or* the Office of Governor Felix P. Camacho.
- Step 4: Submit application along with a copy of a government issued photo identification by June 30, 2008.
