

NAVAL GOVERNMENT OF GUAM

Executive Order Number 5-46.

TO THE PEOPLE OF GUAM.

Because of the present world food shortage and because of the extreme scarcity of certain consumers items on the Island of Guam regulations governing the rationing of certain consumers good and the establishment of ceiling prices on merchandise is necessary.

Therefore *aragraphs 2,3,4,5,6, and 7 of Chapter XXV of the Civil Regulation with the Force and Effect of Law in Guam are hereby revoked.

Paragraph 1 of Chapter XXV of the Civil Regulations with the Force and Effect of Law in Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"The Department of Internal Affairs has the power to establish ceiling prices on commodity offered for sale on Guam by wholesalers, importers and retailers on Guam.

"The Department of Internal Affairs has authority to regulate the sale of any commodity or service on Guam by rationing regulations and price control.

"The Department of Internal Affairs shall make its regulations in connection with rationing and price control and when published they shall be binding upon all wholesalers, importers, and retailers of commodities and services on Guam.

"Any person who is guilty of violating any such regulations published by the Department of Internal Affairs shall, upon conviction in a court of proper jurisdiction, be fined not more than one thousand dollars or imprisoned not longer than six months, or have his license to import, wholesale or retail revoked temporarily or permanently by the Department of Internal Affairs."
