Thank you for your letter dated May 13.

Yes, we are highly concerned with Governor Camacho's visit to Taiwan, and have expressed our opposition to the Governor's office. It is an indisputable fact that Taiwan is an inalienable part of China, and the Government of the People's Republic of China is the sole legitimate representative of China. This is clearly stipulated in the Three Sino-US Joint Communiques.

We are against any official exchanges between the US and Taiwan. The US Government holds explicitly in the Three Joint Communiques that it will conduct only unofficial contacts with Taiwan in such fields as economics, trade, culture, etc.. The official visit and referring Taiwan as *Republic of China* by Governor Camacho does not comply with the One China Policy consistently pursued by the American Government. We hope the Governor and his office will correct the mistake and avoid misleading the public.
